

GIFT GIVING FOR A GREEN HOLIDAY

1. Shop locally and save gas...for fewer CO2 emissions!
2. Give stainless steel water bottles to replace buying single use plastic water bottles.
3. Give a programable thermostat.
4. Give a compost pail, compost bin or rain barrel. And offer to help someone start composting!
5. Gift not-new items from antique stores, thrift shops, yard sales, or your own attic rather than buying new.
6. Give gift certificates for activities/events, not stuff.
7. Arrange for a free Energy Audit through MassSave.
8. Give memberships in environmental organizations or donate in someone's name.
9. Give the gift of your time--an IOU to teach someone to knit, groom/walk someone's dog, ride to the airport or doctor's appointment, weed your garden, babysit for an evening out.
10. Put together theme baskets, in endless combinations:
 - a. A nearly-new flower arranging book, a new pair of flower scissors, a recycled vase, recycled decorative stones.
 - b. Programable thermostat, silk long underwear, draft snake, and fleece shirt.
 - c. A nearly-new vegetarian cookbook, one canning jar of a layered bean soup mix, Omnivore's Dilemma.
 - d. Free trade coffee and chocolates and organic teas.
 - e. Tire pressure gauge and certificates for car washes.
 - f. LED flashlight, LED light bulbs, solar garden lights.
 - g. Glass storage containers, Brita pitcher, SS water bottle.
 - h. Set of glass beer mugs from your attic, 6-pack of local beer, coasters from a favorite pub.
11. Buy a live tree locally to plant outdoors after the holidays. Or, a cut tree from a local lot that the Town can compost.
12. Make your own tree decorations with dried citrus fruit slices, salt dough ornaments in holiday cookie-cutter shapes, strands of cranberries and/or popcorn, and mini wreaths of tiny pinecones/acorns/nuts from your yard. Search online for ideas.
